[VDOT Plans Repairs to Key Tysons Bridge Until Future Vision is Clear](#)

In a decade or two, the intersection of Routes 7 and 123 in Tysons may consist of an at-grade intersection topped by an overhead park and pedestrian amenities.

In the meantime, drivers starting next year will benefit from refurbishments of a pair of two-lane bridges that now vault Route 123 over Route 7. Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) and Fairfax County officials outlined

some of their plans for Tysons' main crossroad during a public-information meeting May 30 at Freedom Hill Elementary School in the Vienna area. Upcoming improvements will include:

- * Concrete-deck repairs.
- * A new 1.5-inch asphalt overlay on the bridge decks.
- * A paint job for the bridges' steel beams.
- * Repairs to the bridges' beam bearings and concrete substructure, including piers and abutments.
- * Slope-protection repairs.
- * Galvanic-anode corrosion protection, plus waterproof coating.
- * Installation of an asphalt-plug joint to prevent water leakage from the deck from damaging the structure below.

At a Fairfax County Board Transportation Committee meeting Tuesday, staff discussed a proposal that would give local residents permits to exempt them from cut-through restrictions either currently in place or to be established. Dranesville District Supervisor John Foust said the idea came from a local citizen and was presented by Del. Kathleen Murphy (D-34th District) to the Virginia legislature, who sponsored HB 2033. The legislation allows Fairfax County to "develop a program to issue permits or stickers to residents



of a designated area that will allow such residents to make turns into or out of the designated area during certain times of day where such turns would otherwise be



[Loudoun Supervisors Seek to Clear Up Sign Regulations for Rural Businesses](#)

Signage complaints against rural area businesses in the Catoctin and Blue Ridge districts have pushed the Loudoun County Board of Supervisors to consider amendments to the county's zoning ordinance. The board in April unanimously agreed to direct staff to review amendment proposals, initiate a meeting with rural businesses and provide recommendations by the June 4 business meeting. Proposals from the offices of supervisors Geary Higgins (R-Catoctin) and Tony Buffington (R-Blue Ridge) include a reduction or elimination of the permit fee for rural signs, permitting farm or farm market signs up to 40 square feet and permitting the same amount of signs for farms and farm markets and wayside stands, with four signs offsite and six signs onsite.

As well as Loudoun County is doing economically - high household incomes, low unemployment rate - it can't escape the shortfall of housing or the scrutiny for not dedicating funding toward affordable workforce housing. The affordable housing challenge was the main point of discussion during the Loudoun Chamber's PolicyMaker Series event on May 28. The discussion featured keynote speaker, U.S. Sen. Tim Kaine (D), who described investment into workforce housing as an important community builder. "I think it's a really important issue for local communities to tackle, and I don't know of a single local government in Virginia that isn't grappling with this issue," Kaine said.



[Loudoun School Board Votes to Send Another Class to Fairfax's TJ](#)

The Loudoun County School Board voted to extend its agreement with Fairfax County Public Schools to send students to Thomas Jefferson High School of Science and Technology, or TJ, after making two amendments during its Tuesday meeting. Because Fairfax County chooses to extend the contract on a



yearly basis, the Loudoun School Board once again weighed the decision of whether to send another class to TJ next year or discontinue Loudoun's participation at TJ. Almost 90 Loudoun residents, including students as young as second-graders, spoke before the board in favor of continuing the agreement with Fairfax County.

[Supporters Call Proposed \\$84M Sports Complex A "Game-Changer" for Prince William County](#)

Brian Woolfolk, a parent and coach with the Dale City Lightning Track Club, says the county's proposal for an \$84 million indoor sports complex would be a "game changer" for local track athletes. Woolfolk was one of more than a dozen people who spoke in support of the project before the Board of County Supervisors on May 7. A specific location for the complex hasn't been determined, but plans call for it to be

somewhere in the eastern part of the county. It's one of several projects the Prince William board is considering as part of a \$200 million bond referendum for parks, along with a \$400 million bond referendum for road projects. The supervisors are expected to vote June 18 whether to put the questions on the November ballot.



[Candland: Tough Mudder Won't Return to Silver Lake Park](#)

Tough Mudder's days at Silver Lake Park are numbered, according to Prince William County Supervisor Pete Candland. Candland, whose Gainesville District includes Silver Lake Park, told a crowd gathered Thursday night for a town hall meeting at Heritage Hunt that this year would indeed be the first and last that Silver Lake, a nature-based public park outside Haymarket, would host the endurance and obstacle event. Tough Mudder is expected to draw more than 9,000 participants to western Prince William County this Saturday and Sunday for the first such event ever held in the Washington, D.C., metro area. The event begins at about 6 a.m. Saturday, June 1 and will wrap up by about 2 p.m. on Sunday, June 2.

The proposed \$5 million project involves reconstructing Route 602 from VA 9956 (Academic Avenue) to 0.36-mile north of Academic Avenue to improve safety for motorists, bicyclists and pedestrians.


