



Notice to Our Members April 20, 2020

NAHB: The Small Business Administration has announced that the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) and Economic Injury Disaster Loan Program (EIDL) have run out of funding. NAHB has advocated to Congress that more funding be provided and that land developers, multifamily property owners, and a larger percentage of homebuilders be made eligible for the programs. The IRS has postponed the deadlines for both filings and payments to July 15, which you can read more about [here](#). Note that in Virginia, the filing deadline has only been postponed to June 1. You would still be liable for interest on any payments owed, however the General Assembly will be voting on Wednesday on a budget amendment that would waive that interest.
